### Executive Director's Message

SIMSA and BHP have set the dates for the next several years of roundtable events, which will allow us to better plan our entire schedules and has locked in a preferred venue location. Our recent Roundtable event was a great success – more below.

# Advocacy

SIMSA's Executive Director - Eric Anderson – met with Alana Ross, Saskatchewan's Minister of Parks, Culture, and Sport as well as the Status of Women on November 24<sup>th</sup>. Also attending was Bernadet Haniil, Executive Director of the Status of Women. Stemming from this conversation, and growing from our E3 initiative early this year, SIMSA will be working with Government to increase the number of women working within our sectors via multiple avenues.

Over the past 6 weeks, SIMSA has met with several countries in regard to seeing SIMSA members become suppliers into these regions. The countries include Great Britain, Kazakhstan, Poland, Indonesia, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE.

Several meetings with multiple Federal Ministries are planned for December. A call with the Minister of Defence's office focused on several forthcoming initiatives that will impact members – more soon on that.

## **Nuclear**

Recently SIMSA met with a delegation from Poland in Saskatoon hosted by Ministry of Trade and Export Development (TED), and Global Affairs Canada (GAC). Poland is a new to nuclear power jurisdiction and is currently building four AP1000 grid scale reactors with up to 6 more grid scale and numerous Small Modular Reactors are planned. Our discussions with the Polish delegation focused on identifying opportunities for our members and sharing lessons learned from the development of our nuclear supply

chain in Saskatchewan. SIMSA is now coordinating with our Polish counterpart at the Polish Chamber of Power Industry and Environmental Protection to share business opportunities in Poland for our membership.

In addition, SIMSA participated in TED and GAC organized delegation from Indonesia in Saskatoon to discuss future collaboration in mining and nuclear energy development. Indonesia is planning to build out up to 35 GWe of nuclear power by 2060 for decarbonization and energy reliability to support economic growth. SIMSAs discussion with the delegation centered around cooperation in supply chain opportunities and how to build an effective supply chain.

# **Member Services**

You may have seen an e-mail that went out on November 20<sup>th</sup> surrounding a nuclear trade mission to Ontario.

As part of our work in nuclear supply chain development, SIMSA is actively looking to promote Saskatchewan companies to the existing nuclear supply chain. As such, we've partnered with the OCNI to provide subsidized travel to Ontario to take part in nuclear networking opportunities such as the below.

December 9<sup>th</sup>: GEH is going to host a visit to their facility in the morning with a lunch, with a visit to Kinectrics in the afternoon. It will be a visit to their current facility with a VR tour of the constructed BWRX-300 at Darlington and likely some talks about their new engineering and training facility currently also under construction.

December 10<sup>th</sup>: ONCI Luncheon with B2B meetings with Worley Chemetics, Unified Engineering, TSSA, TEAM INC, Ritepro Ltd, Hatch, Atkins Realis, GEH, Kinectrics, and more!

December 11th: Tours at Stern Labs, TEAMS Inc. and Atkins Realis.
